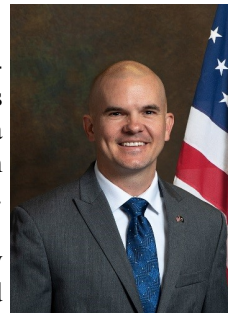


### **From the Desk of Mayor Eric Haas**

### **From the Desk of City Administrator Matthew Kremer**

I want to thank the mayor, council, citizens and staff for all the words of encouragement and support that I've received since starting this position. This is an exciting time to be a resident of Fort Thomas and I am honored to be a larger part of the process in this great city. Like the mayor said, I grew up in Fort Thomas and now live here with my wife, Angie, and our three children. Prior to my experience as a city administrator, I was a police officer for 11 years, which has provided me even more experience and perspective for my current position. I have thoroughly enjoyed getting to know more citizens and hearing issues that citizens are facing throughout the city.



Communicating with our residents is one of the best parts of the job. Although we may not always share the same opinions, hearing other views makes me and this city better.

I look forward to completing the many projects we have underway and on starting many others that have been planned and approved. There are so many positives happening in the city, as I said before, it's a great time to be a Fort Thomas resident. Here are some highlights of current operations:

The renovation of the City Building is nearing completion. It has been a long process but the new space will be much more inviting and accessible for all citizens and staff. The official move-in date will be posted on the city's webpage and social media. We are excited to welcome citizens back to the city building and conduct business as usual in the improved location. We have so many city projects to look forward to in the next 12 months.

After being delayed by COVID, many of our road projects are completed or underway. The city's Public Works team is in full force, replacing necessary curbs and sidewalk sections prior to street repaving. This is critical to improve drainage and safety along our roads while also improving the overall look of our city. The team does excellent concrete work and really makes a road project stand out once complete. Our park projects are also continuing! The Tower Park shelter and restrooms near the softball field are nearing completion, a project that includes many tree plantings, green space and pedestrian connectivity from Cochran Avenue to Clitz Street. This complex will be named after former City Administrator Ron Dill; a ribbon cutting will be held when the project is finished. Improvements are also planned for the Tower Park playground next year along with the addition of a small splash park at Highlands Hills Park. Both projects are set to enter the bid process this fall with the project completion anticipated in the spring of 2023.

We are truly excited that the Brandfuel Company is working on new branding for the city. This process will involve soliciting input from citizens and businesses along with council and staff. The project is projected to be completed by early 2023 with the implementation of signage and other branding options as the process moves forward.

The Central Business District is certainly booming, which means residents need places to park when visiting businesses. Please be respectful of the surrounding neighborhoods and their needs. The city owns the parking lot behind 18 N. Ft. Thomas Ave., which can now be accessed by Miller Lane. This is a convenient place to park and walk to all the wonderful businesses on the avenue. Although it will receive improvements in the future, it is a great asset to the citizens and business owners now.

The north reservoir project with the Northern Kentucky Water District (NKWD) has been completed. This was a necessary improvement to ensure a fresh water supply for all of Northern Kentucky. The NKWD will soon begin the south reservoir project to clean out the remaining water storage on that site. We are working with the NKWD to minimize the impact to our citizens and businesses in the area.

## **A NOTE FROM THE POLICE DEPARTMENT: CHIEF CASEY KILGORE**

The end of summer marks the return of our school year, and the accompanying traffic flow changes. This is always a good time to remind all motorists to watch out for crossing pedestrians, and to remind all crossing pedestrians to make sure traffic has stopped before crossing. Also, several flashing yellow beacons are in place around town. These beacons serve as a warning to motorists that someone is about to cross, but pedestrians must still wait a few seconds to give traveling vehicles the chance to come to a complete stop.

We have a wide variety of transportation devices here in Fort Thomas. Everything from electric bikes, to golf carts, to electric scooters, and everything in between. If you ride a bike, electric scooter, golf cart, etc., or your children do, it is your responsibility to know the ordinances and laws regarding that device. While there are an abundance of laws and ordinances that cover various transportation devices, please always use common sense, drive safely, follow all traffic laws, and look out for other people.

Please keep your valuables safe. Do not leave valuables in your car if possible. Lock your doors. If you must leave something in your car, lock it in the trunk or stow it under a seat out of sight.

Finally, if you see something suspicious or witness a crime, please call dispatch right away. Dispatch is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Our police line goes to our office, which is only staffed during normal business hours. Campbell County Dispatch: 911 for emergencies, 859.292.3622 for non-emergencies.

## **Pedestrian Travel Alert!**

### **Be kind and enjoy our pedestrian connectivity!**

The city has been made aware of issues regarding people walking through town and encountering bikes, electric scooters and even dog walkers. These situations create challenges that could be solved through awareness of others and common courtesy by everyone. Our town has great pedestrian connectivity, which sets us apart from other communities. If you drive through Fort Thomas, you always see walkers, runners, and bikers - even in the rain! While this is a wonderful aspect of living in Fort Thomas, we need to be aware of all parties enjoying and accessing the sidewalks. Bikers and electric scooters should be traveling with traffic. If walkers chose not to use sidewalks, they should walk against traffic for better safety. There are some areas of the city that may be dangerous to ride in the roadway, depending on the operator's age or comfort level. If this is the case, please be respectful of others using the sidewalk. Slow down or stop and make your presence known to others by using a bell or speaking to the pedestrian if possible. Being courteous and kind goes a long way and keeps everyone safer. We ask that parents and guardians of children who operate bikes and electric scooters through town have a discussion regarding personal safety and the safety of others. Ensure that your children understand the rules and consequences if they are hit by a vehicle or harm someone by running into them. There have been too many reports of children operating electric scooters unsafely in the roadway and on the sidewalk. We do not want to see anyone injured while enjoying our city and the nice fall weather that will shortly arrive.
