January 2023 Monthly Report Summary

TRAINING

Officer Chris Vance attended ***Crime Scene Investigation***. This course is designed to meet the needs of the officer and investigator who respond to a crime scene. Emphasis is given to practical skills that are necessary in order to properly process crime scenes. Included in this course are police photography, crime scene sketching, fingerprinting techniques, and investigation of violent crimes.

Officer Joe Paolucci attended ***Leadership Is a Behavior***. This course is designed to be an introduction to basic leadership principles for the patrol officer. It will be extremely beneficial for those who are assigned leadership responsibility in their agency as police training or field training officers. Attendees can expect assignments that will require them to perform activities during hours outside the normal classroom times. The learning outcomes for this course will be identifying the characteristics and principals of a good leader, learning how values can create conflict and how to effectively resolve those conflicts. The student will then use written scenarios to apply leadership principals learned in class. The student will read an assigned book and answer questions about the characteristics of good leadership based on the reading assignment.

RECOGNITION:



Officer Jeremy Moore received the 2022 Governor's Occupant Protection Enforcement Award. During the time frame of October 1, 2021 through September 30, 2022, the Fort Thomas Police Department issued 94 citations for seat belt/child restraint charges. Officer Moore was responsible for 23 of those charges.

ENFORCEMENT:

In January officers wrote 31 speeding charges, 42 charges for non-traffic offenses (i.e., warrants, assaults, disorderly conduct, etc.) and 88 traffic related charges (i.e., suspended OL, no insurance, expired license plate, etc.) Officers also issued 160 written warnings and totaled 11 court appearances. There were 12 drug related charges placed against 7 adults and 4 drug charges placed against 2 juveniles. Three of the individuals are Fort Thomas residents. Traffic stops led to one of the charges.

Trending

Detective's attended the Campbell County Investigators meetings where cases are shared for a collaborative effort to assist in solving cases.

There has been an increase in "scam" cases recently. Updating computer software and strengthening passwords help protect your information online. Do not give personal information over the phone/email.

December showed an increase in theft reports, specifically damaging vehicles in order to steal the catalytic converters. These items are stolen for the precious metals inside and are scrapped. This is an issue with all NKY, not just Fort Thomas.
