September 2022 Monthly Report Summary

COMMUNITY EVENTS



St. Thomas Elementary School honored First Responders in tribute to Patriot Day. They invited the Fort Thomas Police Department and Fire Department to join the students for recess. They played kick ball, Gaga ball pit, football, four square

and more. The teachers and students stated they appreciate all the things the Police and Fire Departments do for our community.

This year was the Seventeenth Annual Merchants and Music Festival. Congratulations to Chanda Calentine, and all the members of the Merchants and Music committee and the sponsors for their dedication and hard work to make this amazing event enjoyable for everyone. The police department provided several officers for the event.

TRAINING

Chief Casey Kilgore and Lieutenants Brent Moening and Adam Noe attended **Police Executive Command Course**. This course is designed for Kentucky Police Chiefs, Sheriffs, Directors and their executive staff. The curriculum, which is updated annually, addresses the most current leadership, administrative and legal issues confronting law enforcement executives. This course meets the statutory requirements regarding Asset Forfeiture training. This course will enable the student to identify the most current leadership, administrative and legal issues confronting law enforcement executives. A written assignment will be required and graded Pass/Fail based on a rubric grading system/chart.

Sergeant Matthew Marksbury attended **Academy of Police Supervision**. APS is the first course in the leadership development for Sergeants or First Line Supervisors. Students are expected to complete all reading and writing assignments and to actively participate in practical based exercises designed to develop or enhance their supervisory abilities. Students can expect assignments that will require them to perform activities during hours outside the normal classroom times. The learning outcomes for this course will be for students to apply leadership and demonstrate an understanding of constitutional and administrative law, emotional and social intelligence, change, ethical decision making, problem solving, emotional survival, and public speaking into their role as a supervisor. Students must be capable of moderate physical activity.

Officer Brad Reichenbach attended **Firearms Instructor Course**. This course provides instruction from developing courses of fire to establishing a comprehensive firearms program for your agency. Students will be instructed on both handgun and patrol rifle. The course will include low light procedures for both weapon systems. Students are required to pass Day 1 Handgun and Rifle Qualifications to remain in the class. The course will include developing firearms training, weapon familiarization, student led courses of fire, patrol rifle zero practical, designing a course of fire, legal considerations for firearms instructors, ballistics, and firearms safety. There will be one low light session scheduled during the training. The schedule may vary during the two weeks due to inclement weather. It is required that students receive at least 40 hours of training on the patrol rifle prior to attending the firearms instructor course. Students should be highly proficient with their weapon manipulation and shooting skills.

Lieutenant Brent Moening and Officer Nicholas Hoffman attended **2022 Midwest Crisis Negotiators Conference**. There were multiple guest speakers and Case Studies including:

- Dumpster Barricade After Shootout with Police
- Kidnapping for Ransom
- The Unrecognized Line Between Domestic Violence and Crisis Negotiations
- Bank Robbery Hostage Negotiation
- Hostage Barricade at Colleyville Texas Synagogue
- South Champion Barricade Involving U.S. Air Force Veteran

Lieutenant Nathan Day attended *Instructor Development Workshop*. This 24-hour course primarily serves to give insight into adult education and enhance the instructional skills and styles of experienced instructors. The course focuses on best teaching and training practices, and it enhances understanding of instructor competencies set by the International Board for Standards for Training, Performance, and Instruction. This course emphasizes the active, learner-centered style of delivery and student experience. Instructors of the course model how to facilitate classroom discussions and motivate and encourage participants. Participants in the course will reflect on their learning and have many opportunities for self-evaluation. The course follows a problem-based training model, focusing on providing performance, technical, and higher-level skills instruction. Organizations that want courses delivered with professional polish could benefit from this professional development opportunity to ensure proficiency in training methodology and strategy. It incorporates effective problem-based instruction in addition to the traditional lecture format. Facilitation of classroom discussions, motivation and encouragement of participants, and self-evaluation are modeled throughout this course. Expert-level instructors deliver this modular course within a three-day time frame. Training occurs in the form of lectures, group discussions, practical exercises, and self-assessments. Participants spend significant time working in small groups and participating in facilitated discussions and teach-backs to develop and enhance their training skills.

RECOGNITION:

A note of appreciation was received from a Newman Avenue family regarding an issue that occurred in the early morning hours. They wrote to say "Thank you for protecting our home and family. We appreciate your care and concern for our community and want to extend our gratitude to let you know we support you." The responding Officers were Geoff Lucas, Alex Hall, Will Martin, and Lieutenant Nathan Day.

ENFORCEMENT:

In September officers wrote 29 speeding charges, 12 charges for non-traffic offenses (i.e., warrants, assaults, disorderly conduct, etc.) and 87 traffic related charges (i.e., suspended OL, no insurance, expired license plate, etc.) Officers also issued 69 written warnings and totaled 28 court appearances. There were 14 drug related charges placed against 11 adults. Two of the individuals are Fort Thomas residents. Traffic stops led to five of the charges.
