July 2023 Monthly Report Summary

COMMUNITY EVENTS:

Officers conducted a walk-thru of all Fort Thomas Schools to review floor plans and re-familiarize themselves with the buildings in case they need to respond for emergency type situations.

TRAINING:

School Resource Officer Zac Rohlfer attended the **2023 National Association of School Resource Officers Conference**. The conference incorporates the SRO triad concept of educator, informal counselor, and law enforcement. Training sessions included debriefs of school shootings and lessons learned, school safety reform (major legislation and top cases), regional team building events and updates, and many nationally known keynote speakers. These trainings teach valuable insights that allow Fort Thomas PD and school district leaders to work together to strengthen the security in our schools. Each year the NASRO conference provides the top training available to school resource officers nationwide.

Officer Kalin Holland attended **Enhanced Handgun Performance**. This course is designed to enhance the officer's performance with their duty handgun. It is an excellent builder for students who want to increase their handgun skills that they have learned in basic training or other approved firearms courses. The course also goes beyond the fundamentals and teaches officers how to react and deploy their handgun quickly and accurately. Timed live fire drills will be utilized along with the use of cover, speed, and situational drills.

Detective Brandon Vance and Officer Nicholas Hoffman attended **Supervision of Forensic Units**. The purpose of this course is to provide students with knowledge and skills needed to lead and manage investigative units. Topics will include organization of the investigative unit, selection of personnel, case assignment, file management, administrative duties, property room management, internal investigations, investigative techniques, crime analysis, budgeting, operational issues, narcotics investigations, vice investigations, and investigating officer-involved incidents.

Lieutenant Nathan Day has completed his third week at *The FBI Academy*. The FBI is the Federal Bureau of Investigation's Law Enforcement Training and Research Center near the town of Quantico in Stafford County, Virginia. Operated by the bureau's Training Division, it was first opened for use on May 7, 1972, on 385 acres of woodland.

ENFORCEMENT:

In July officers wrote 51 speeding charges, 27 charges for non-traffic offenses (i.e., warrants, assaults, disorderly conduct, etc.) and 101 traffic related charges (i.e., suspended OL, no insurance, expired license plate, etc.) Officers also issued 58 written warnings and totaled 6 court appearances. There were 14 drug related charges placed against 11 adults and one juvenile. Three of the individuals are Fort Thomas residents. Traffic stops led to six of the charges.
