April 2023 Monthly Report Summary

COMMUNITY EVENTS:

School Resource Officer Zac Rohlfer spoke to the middle school 7th and 8th grade health classes about scooter laws and scooter safety. They are then going to use the information on a problem-based learning project.

On Saturday, April 22nd Officer Nick Hoffman and Detective Brandon Vance were on hand at the Fort Thomas City Building to collect old, used and expired medications. The Fort Thomas Police participated in the bi-annual <u>DEA "Drug Take Back Day."</u> During the four hour event, citizens dropped off medications so they could be destroyed. This helps avoid the dangers associated with someone taking expired medicines, children accidentally taking it, and to avoid contaminating landfills or waterways by simply putting it in the trash or flushing it.

The total medication collected at the Fort Thomas Police Department site event was 137 pounds! Departments throughout Campbell County and Northern Kentucky participated, with Fort Thomas being at, or near the top collection site each spring & fall!

In addition to drug collection, members of The Fort Thomas Lions Club once again participated in this now joint event. The Lions Club collected 46 pairs of old prescription glasses that will be refurbished, prescriptions verified, sent to impoverished parts of Central America, and given to those in need.

If you missed this event, The Fort Thomas Police does have a collection drop box available in their lobby, accessible during business hours. Please, no liquids, needles or vitamins. The next collection event will be October 2023.

TRAINING:

Officers completed the following *Roll Call Training*:

- Critical Policy guizzes for Domestic Violence and Juveniles.
- Records and Reports, Traffic Law Enforcement, Residential and Vehicle Lockouts, Traffic Control, Radio Communication, Mobile Data Computer Terminals, Accident Investigation, and Bike Patrol.
- DOCJT Mandatory Online Training
- O Vehicle Operations Training at the DAV and online quiz

Officer Jeremy Moore completed <u>Patrol Rifle Deployment Course</u>. This is not a basic rifle course. This course will prepare the student to deploy a patrol rifle in a public venue such as a school, sports facility, shopping center, or special event. Topics will include moving and shooting, target identification and discrimination, distance, and close quarter engagements. This course is limited to patrol rifles chambered in .223 and 5.56 calibers.

Lieutenant Nathan Day and Sergeant Matt Marksbury completed <u>Axon TASER Instructor</u> <u>Certification Course</u>. This Instructor course teaches students how to develop and safely execute scenarios and isolation drills, and provide more in-depth scenario training. Students will learn how to develop and safely implement scenarios; isolation drills and conduct teach backs to hone their instructor skills.

ENFORCEMENT:

In April officers wrote 8 speeding charges, 19 charges for non-traffic offenses (i.e., warrants, assaults, disorderly conduct, etc.) and 31 traffic related charges (i.e., suspended OL, no insurance, expired license plate, etc.) Officers also issued 72 written warnings and totaled 9 court appearances. There were 8 drug related charges placed against 5 adults. Traffic stops led to 7 of the charges.
