June 2023 Monthly Report Summary

COMMUNITY EVENTS:



The Annual Touch-A-**Truck** event sponsored bv the Recreation Department was held Tower Park. Lieutenant **Brent** Moening, Sergeant Derek Faught Officer Sean Donelan were on hand to talk with the children and provide cruiser demonstrations.

TRAINING:

Officer Brandon Laffin attended <u>Firearms Instructor</u>. The Firearms Instructor Course provides instruction from developing shooting courses to establishing a comprehensive firearms program for your agency. It includes courses for many weapons issued or authorized by an agency including off duty weapons, handgun and patrol rifle. The course will include developing firearms training, weapon familiarization, student led courses of fire, patrol rifle zero practical, designing a course of fire, legal considerations for firearms instructors, ballistics, and firearms safety. NOTE: There will be two low light sessions scheduled during the training and may vary depending on circumstances such as weather. Students are required to pass an entry handgun and rifle qualification on the first day to remain in the course.

Our department currently has a unit of six <u>Designated Marksmen</u>. The goal of this unit is to have multiple officers readily available who are equipped and trained to engage threats with precision and/or at longer-than-average distances. 2023 was the first year the team assembled to train together, having a department range day specifically for developing the Designated Marksman Team. They worked on perfecting zeros, range sheets, offset calculations, positional shooting, accuracy at distance, and understanding limitations.

Office Tyler Laffin attended <u>Digital Photography</u>. Digital Photography is a 40-hour course designed for patrol officers and investigators who need advanced training in police photography. Blocks of instruction will include: Exposure and Metering, Low-light and Flash photography, Depth of Field, White Balance and more. The Nikon D-7100 camera system will be used for all exercises. All cameras and equipment are provided by DOCJT for this training.

School Resource Officer Zac Rohlfer and Lieutenant Adam Noe attended the <u>Safe Schools and Communities Conference</u> in Richmond, KY. The conference included presentations by many nationally known keynote speakers. Training included breakout sessions on mental health issues, working with special populations of students, school law update, social media trends, and threat assessment updates.

ENFORCEMENT:

In June officers wrote 13 speeding charges, 11 charges for non-traffic offenses (i.e., warrants, assaults, disorderly conduct, etc.) and 47 traffic related charges (i.e., suspended OL, no insurance, expired license plate, etc.) Officers also issued 56 written warnings and totaled 24 court appearances. There were 5 drug related charges placed against 5 adults. Traffic stops led to 3 of the charges.

Detectives received twenty-one new cases during the months of May and June. Of those cases, there are twenty-three offenses that are being actively investigated. Cases from last month have resulted in arrests, warrants, or indictments and their investigations are ongoing.

Trending

There was an increase in theft cases, specifically vehicles, bikes, and vehicle parts. Please be vigilante and lock your doors and take the keys to vehicles inside the house.

There have been a recent increase of theft of catalytic converters from Hyundais and Toyotas.
Bellevue, Covington, and Newport also experienced an increase in these offenses in June.

Of the bikes stolen, multiple were recovered and juveniles arrested. There were two burglaries of businesses and those investigations are ongoing. It appears the suspects involved are also involved in burglaries in Florence and Indiana.
