August 2023 Monthly Report Summary

TRAINING:

Detective Brandon Vance attended ***Leading the Investigative Unit***. The purpose of this course is to provide students with knowledge and skills needed to lead and manage investigative units. Topics will include organization of the investigative unit, selection of personnel, case assignment, file management, administrative duties, property room management, internal investigations, investigative techniques, crime analysis, budgeting, operational issues, narcotics investigations, vice investigations, and investigating officer-involved incidents.

Officer William Martin attended ***Digital Photography***. This is a 40-hour course designed for patrol officers and investigators who need advanced training in police photography. Blocks of instruction will include: Exposure and Metering, Low-light and Flash photography, Depth of Field, White Balance and more. The Nikon D-7100 camera system will be used for all exercises. All cameras and equipment are provided by DOCJT for this training.

Lieutenant Brent Moening and Officer Nick Hoffman attended ***Negotiation Workshop Series: Unlocking Solutions for Successful Crisis Resolution***. Workshops included: Suicide by Cop * Keeping Your Team Relevant * Barricaded Subject Who Shot at US Marshals.

RECOGNITION:

Note of appreciation was received from Lieutenant John Dunn, SIRT Commander recognizing Officers Nick Hoffman, Brad Reichenbach and Chris Vance. These three Officers took it upon themselves to obtain a Bosch CDR Kit free of charge from the Kentucky Transportation Department that would have cost over \$30,000. Campbell County has never had this very expensive tool that will be used on every accident reconstruction scene. The dedication to their profession and the team is greatly appreciated.

MISCELLANEOUS:

This year, 20 out of our 22 eligible officers completed the physical fitness test. Several officers improved their scores over last year, and multiple people achieved the overall level of "advanced" or "elite." The physical fitness test was developed by the Department of Criminal Justice Training, and is mandatory for all new police recruits. Our officers have made fitness a priority within the department, which in turn has been shown to reduce liability, workplace injuries, and use of force. We are very proud of our officers for their commitment to keeping our community safe, and this is just one example of their dedication to excellence.





Six of our officers competed in the 2023 NKY Police Chiefs' Association Pistol Match. The match was split into two divisions: a division for shooters using red dots on their guns and a division for shooters using iron sights. Officers Brandon Laffin, Zac Rohlfer and Chris Vance competed as a team in the iron sights division while Officers Joe Paolucci, Brad Reichenbach and Jeremy Moore in competed as a team in the red dot division. Both teams took first place in their respective divisions. This is the 5th consecutive year that Fort Thomas Police Department has taken first place in the competition.

ENFORCEMENT:

In August officers wrote 20 speeding charges, 43 charges for non-traffic offenses (i.e., warrants, assaults, disorderly conduct, etc.) and 55 traffic related charges (i.e., suspended OL, no insurance, expired license plate, etc.) Officers also issued 53 written warnings and totaled 10 court appearances. There were 17 drug related charges placed against 12 adults and one juvenile. Three of the individuals are Fort Thomas residents. Traffic stops led to 7 of the charges.

Fort Thomas Police Investigations

July/August 2023 Monthly Reports

Detectives received thirty-six new cases these two months, of those cases there were forty-three offenses that are being actively investigated. Cases from last month have resulted in arrests, warrants, or indictments and their investigations are ongoing.

Trending

There was an increase in theft cases, specifically vehicles and vehicle parts. Please be vigilante and lock your doors and take the keys to vehicles inside the house.

There has been a recent increase of auto thefts of Kia and Hyundais. This is due to a flaw in the ignition. Videos on Snapchat have caused a nationwide surge in these types of crimes. Evidence from stolen cars from Ohio and recovered stolen vehicles have been processed and Detectives are awaiting further leads.

After receiving complaints from Royal Cove Apartments about packages being stolen Detectives set up a bait package equipped with a GPS. Within a week, several victims were identified, property recovered, and four subjects were arrested. The investigation is on going at this time.

The FTPD does not request gift cards of any sort in lieu of arrests. If you receive these type of calls, please call Dispatch at (859) 292-3622 to verify that the FTPD is actually trying to reach you.
