September 2023 Monthly Report Summary

COMMUNITY EVENTS:

The police department provided several officers for the event.

School Resource Officer Zac Rohlfer spoke to all the middle school technology classes about digital safety. This talk includes internet safety, as well as current issues in the schools revolving around technology. The students learn about the issues revolving around technology that get most students in trouble and why current technology leads to many problems for teens and young people.

TRAINING:

Lieutenant Brent Moening and Officer Nicholas Hoffman attended **2023 Midwest Crisis Negotiators Conference**. Topics included: Hacienda Heights barricade - TPI's and texting * Negotiate like you'll see them again: A Psychiatric Odyssey * Negotiation with armed man after attempted breach of FBI Field Office * Crisis in Cary - Twenty hour standoff with armed man barricaded with his 11 year old son * Protracted Negotiations / Transitions/ Policies and Procedures * Twenty-nine hour standoff with hostage * Roadside / Rural Negotiations * I-94 Standoff.

Officer Nicholas Hoffman attended **IACP First-Line Leadership Course**. First Line Leadership is a three-day course focused on providing leadership skills to current and aspiring leaders and equips participants with knowledge to advance in their supervisory role. The course features both interactive and engaging group discussions and scenarios, taught by current and former law enforcement professionals. By the end of this course, attendees should have a set of strategies and tools to call upon when making decisions, inspiring followers, and achieving organizational goals. Focus areas include:

Officer Brandon Laffin attend **Firearms Instructor**. The Firearms Instructor Course provides instruction from developing shooting courses to establishing a comprehensive firearms program for your agency. It includes courses for many weapons issued or authorized by an agency including off duty weapons, handgun and patrol rifle. The course will include developing firearms training, weapon familiarization, student led courses of fire, patrol rifle zero practical, designing a course of fire, legal considerations for firearms instructors, ballistics, and firearms safety.

Detectives Wayne Dutle and Brandon Vance attended **Crime Scene Processing & Evidence Identification**. John Mulholland has been the Crime Scene investigator and Latent Fingerprint Examiner for over 30 years. He has a degree in Analytical Chemistry and hold certificates from the FBI, BCII, Miami Valley Regional Crime Lab, ATF and many more in the field of Criminal Forensic Investigation. He has testified as an expert witness in these disciplines in three different states and provides support to multiple local and federal agencies. John has instructed for local universities and law classes as well as a featured guest speaker at the Tennessee Mountain Criminal Justice Conference. Some of the cases he has been involved in have been featured on "Forensic Files" and A&E. This course is designed to assist those personnel investigating crime scenes, collecting evidence and preparing these cases for court. Course Objectives include: Crime Scene Investigation and Documentation * Evidence Collection and Processing * Search Warrant Documentation and Processing * Crime Scene Sketch and Detailed Drawing * Fingerprint Development on various types of evidence (practical methods and proper equipment) * Hands on Evidence Processing.



Lieutenant Nathan Day was one of the 199 law enforcement officers that graduated the FBI National Academy in Quantico, Virginia. The 287th session of the National Academy consisted of men and women from 46 states and the District of Columbia. The class included members of law enforcement agencies from 21 countries, four military organizations and three federal civilian organizations.

ENFORCEMENT:

In September officers wrote 19 speeding charges, 25 charges for non-traffic offenses (i.e., warrants, assaults, disorderly conduct, etc.) and 52 traffic related charges (i.e., suspended OL, no insurance, expired license plate, etc.) Officers also issued 30 written warnings and totaled 25 court appearances. There were 9 drug related charges placed against 7 adults. None of the individuals are Fort Thomas residents. Traffic stops led to 7 of the charges.
