COMMUNITY EVENTS:

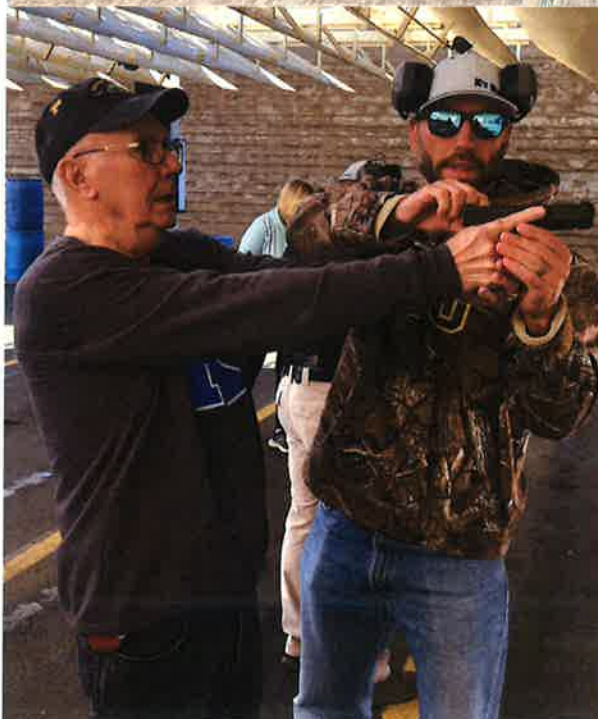


Officer Sean Donelan, who is also a Veteran, was asked to flip the coin at the beginning of the Highlands game on Veteran's Day.

2023 Fort Thomas Citizens Police Academy



The Fort Thomas Citizens Police Academy just completed its 2023 session, and the program was a great success! We really enjoyed getting to know our citizens better as they got an inside look at how the police department functions, and what our officers do in their day-to-day jobs. In the last seven weeks of the program, the participants received in-depth presentations concerning use of force, traffic enforcement and pursuits, accident reconstruction, traffic stops, School Resource Officer program, SWAT, Criminal Investigations, DUI enforcement, and a panel discussion with city leaders and police regarding the future of law enforcement. In addition, participants were afforded the opportunity to take part in optional firearms training and a mock Crime Scene Investigation. By all accounts, the students thoroughly enjoyed their experience, and it was a great way for members of the Police Department to hear the concerns of our citizens first hand. We are extremely grateful for the citizens who sacrificed three hours a week for ten weeks to be better educated about their local Police Department! We cannot wait to host the next class!

Sergeant Michael Dietz received his **Police Instructor Certificate and Kentucky Law Enforcement Council Instructor Pin**. He has complied with the standards prescribed under KRS 15.330 to instruct in law enforcement training in Kentucky.

Sergeant Matt Marksbury attended *Interview and Interrogation*. This course focuses upon the interviewing of individuals during criminal investigations utilizing Cognitive Interview techniques. Practical exercises and role playing will be used to allow students to practice Active Listening Skills, Rapport Building Techniques, and Cognitive Interview Techniques. The course is designed to increase the amount of information received from potential witnesses, victims, and suspects during investigations.

Officers participated in the annual *Low Light Firearms Training*. This range included the use of both duty pistol and patrol rifle. Fundamentals were the focus for this range. These drills are designed to bring Officers to real world scenarios by raising their heart rate.

ENFORCEMENT:

In November officers wrote 13 speeding charges, 22 charges for non-traffic offenses (i.e., warrants, assaults, disorderly conduct, etc.) and 43 traffic related charges (i.e., suspended OL, no insurance, expired license plate, etc.) Officers also issued 60 written warnings and totaled 21 court appearances. There were 9 drug related charges placed against 7 adults. Traffic stops led to all of the charges.
