


Retirements

FBI National Academy

Lieutenant Nathan Day was one of the 199 law enforcement officers that graduated the FBI National Academy in Quantico, Virginia. The 287th session of the National Academy consisted of men and women from 46 states and the District of Columbia. The class included members of law enforcement agencies from 21 countries, four military organizations and three federal civilian organizations.



2023 Citizens Police Academy



The Fort Thomas Citizens Police Academy held its first class in 2023. The program was a huge success. The academy gave us a chance to get to know our citizens better as they got an inside look at how the police department functions, and what our officers do in their day-to-day jobs. Throughout the ten week program, the participants received in-depth presentations concerning use of force, traffic enforcement and pursuits, accident reconstruction, traffic stops, the School Resource Officer program, SWAT, Criminal Investigations, DUI enforcement, and a panel discussion with city leaders and police regarding the future of law enforcement. In addition, participants were afforded the opportunity to take part in optional firearms training and a mock Crime Scene Investigation. By all accounts, the participants thoroughly enjoyed their experience, and it was a great way for members of the Police Department to hear the concerns of our citizens first hand. We are extremely grateful to all of the sponsors and for the citizens who sacrificed three hours each week for ten weeks to learn about their local Police Department.
