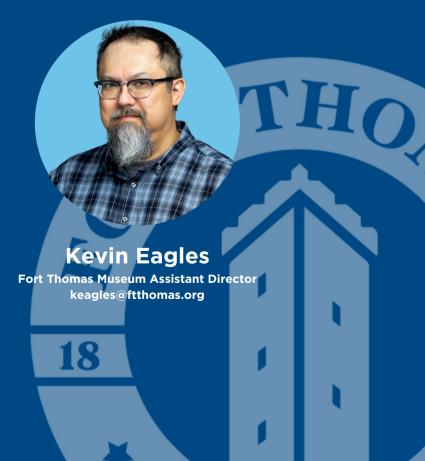

The City of Fort Thomas had a vibrant 2023 offering more than 25 events around town and bringing in many new businesses.

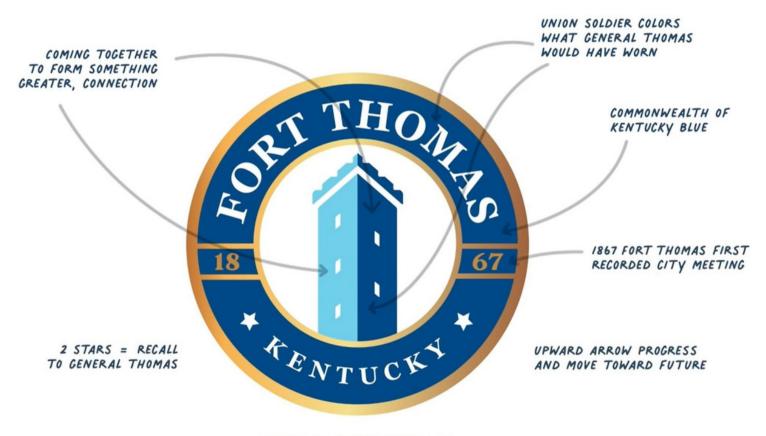

BRANDING A CITY

Staff, committees, and the public got the chance to brand our city.

We finished our rebranding efforts in July 2023 with the launch of our new user friendly website. This website features additional resources including a full downloadable calendar highlighting city events, board and council meetings with agendas. We updated our businesses, city staff, current news, and added special features connecting community partners, organizations and frequently asked questions.

COMMUNITY EVENTS

Events encourage community growth, bonding, & lasting partnerships.

Through a partnership with muralist, Ben Harrison, we have a new mural behind 18 North honoring Colonel Cochran, former post commander at the Fort Thomas Military Barracks. Colonel Cochran was noted as an avid gardener and kept pristine flower beds including his favorite, Red Calla Lilly. This was created during a co-sponsored event with the Cultural Arts District. Other collaborations include Taking Root (Great Tree Summit, Feb 25), Fort Thomas Forest Conservancy, Meet NKY, Sam Scott Celebration of Life, CORA, Leadership NKY, Highland Plaza Pop-up Party, Cerberus Den, QUEST, Small Business Saturday and many more.









COMMUNITY OF BUSINESSES

The City partnered with the Fort Thomas Business Association offering free memberships to all 41075 businesses. We hosted meetings in the Mess Hall and worked together to create support between existing and new businesses. By the end of the year, our membership grew to over 100 businesses. This laid the groundwork for the new collaboration for the FTBA and NKY Chamber.



FARM FRESH

The Fort Thomas Farmers Market led by Tiffany Tomeo, had an exciting 2023! This year we were named the number 3 farmers market in the NKY/Cincinnati region by City Beat voters. We hosted over 80 vendors between our regular markets and holiday shows. Goat yoga was an enormous success, raising even more money than we did in 2022. Our partnership with Campbell County Extension and Woodfill Elementary was a wonderful opportunity for third graders to learn about growing and selling microgreens, which they did at the market in May. We also started hosting cooking demos and sampling events to showcase products. This helped boost vendor sales significantly. We are grateful for the sponsorships provided by Tracy Davis, State Farm Insurance and Derek Vater, Heartland Bank.

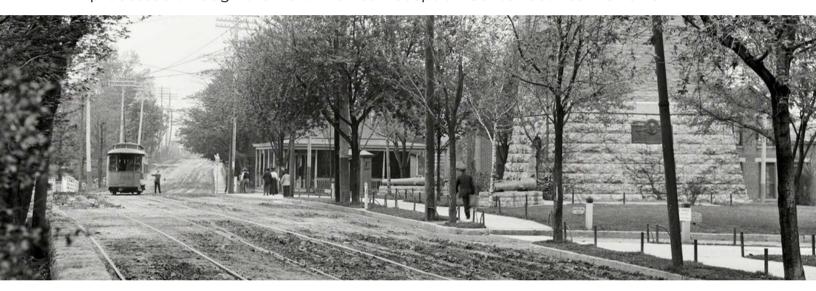






WHAT'S HAPPENING AT THE MUSEUM

The Fort Thomas Military and Community History Museum continues to build its collection and strengthen its connections to organizations and supporters in Fort Thomas. We provided resources and artifacts to both Samuel Woodfill and Robert D. Johnson Elementary Schools as they planned their centennial celebrations. A grant from the Kentucky Local History Trust Fund allowed us to purchase a second book scanner that enabled our volunteer staff to scan books and documents and save them in digital form. So far, we have nearly 50 years of HHS yearbooks saved in searchable PDF form. We continued with our ongoing commemoration of the Fort's role during WWII with our "War Stories" exhibit, sharing stories of some of the more than 250,000 soldiers and airmen who processed through the Fort Thomas Reception Center between 1940-1944.

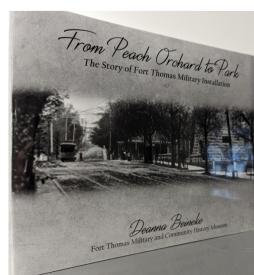


NEW HISTORY BOOK DROPPING IN 2024
