February 2024 Monthly Report Summary

COMMUNITY EVENTS:

Woodfill Elementary students participated in City Appreciation Week. Students stopped by with Lifesavers and handmade cards for the Officers.

TRAINING:

Officer Sean Donelan attended ***KY LEN Peer Support***. This course is for agencies who wish to establish or maintain peer support teams as part of a comprehensive wellness program. The instructional blocks will provide the student with the necessary skills in Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM) to assist those within their agency who have been involved in and/or witnessed a traumatic event or critical incident (as defined by KRS 15.518 (9)(a)). Skills covered are intervention-based and designed to mitigate the crisis response, reduce stigma, foster natural resiliency through stabilization and symptom reduction, and a return to adaptive functioning or if needed, the facilitation of access to continued care. Topic areas covered will consist of Assisting Individuals in Crisis, Groups Crisis Interventions, Suicide prevention, intervention, and postvention, as well as best policies and practices for agencies to adopt. Participants will also receive credit through the International Critical Incident Stress Foundation.

Officer Jeremy Moore attended ***Advanced Latent Print Development***. Fingerprints are often quite compelling circumstantial evidence in a criminal trial. Before this evidence can be introduced in court, it must first be located at a crime scene and collected. This course will provide patrol officers and investigators with the knowledge and skills they will need to perform this task. Topics will include chemical developing and the use of alternate light sources for the development of latent fingerprints.

ENFORCEMENT:

In February officers wrote 36 speeding charges, 39 charges for non-traffic offenses (i.e., warrants, assaults, disorderly conduct, etc.) and 143 traffic related charges (i.e., suspended OL, no insurance, expired license plate, etc.) Officers also issued 200 written warnings and totaled 19 court appearances. There were 23 drug related charges.

January/February 2024 Monthly Reports

Detectives received eighteen new cases these past two months, all of those cases are being actively investigated. There is a tremendous amount of follow up being done for the cases in 2023. In 2024, Det. C. Vance was assigned to the Investigations Section. Det. Duple went back to Patrol.

Trending

There was an increase in theft cases and thefts by using scams. Sadly, most of the time after months of investigating it is discovered the scammers are from out of the country. FTPD has met many roadblocks with court orders due to these issues.

With technology, the amount of sex crimes reported has increased. Please be mindful to educate juveniles on what is appropriate and to check on their electronic devices.

The FTPD has been successful this year in capturing some robbery suspects, a burglary suspect, and multiple thefts suspects. With the weather becoming warmer, please remember to lock your cars and to take valuables inside. Thieves target cars that are unlocked and steal items. There has been an increase in this type of activity and the City of Fort Thomas is targeted by others that live elsewhere.
